There will be a coaching piece in the packet for a "Coaching observation clinic." Incorporation suggestions included: 1. Incorporate into the registration fees, 2. Optional package for family participation, or 3. A fundraiser for the league.

### 6.3. Field(s) Report

- The Field committee met before the District meeting.
- Carlos Rubio has starting paperwork on a Field Foundation.
- Several motions were voted on:
  1. *Name* → *San Jose Soccer Complex Foundation*  
Approved by the majority with two opposed. Opposition was stated due to the potential misunderstanding that the foundation monies and efforts would be used for city fields other than the large complex envisioned in San Jose eventually. The foundation papers will be drawn for the monies and efforts to be spent in other cities by the board members' votes.
  2. *Seed Foundation Money* → *\$15,000*  
This money will be used to fund the starting costs for the foundation. Approved by all voting members present.
  3. *Members* → *League Presidents (currently 17 leagues), District Commissioner and Assistant District Commissioner.*  
Approved by all voting members present.

## FINAL REPORT

2002 District II ODP Tryouts 5/4, 5/5, 5/11, 5/12

### Overview

A total of 636 players registered for the tryouts, which comprised 4 days over two successive weekends. There were a total of 353 boys and 283 girls. Six volunteers registered over 160 players at the fields during the two weekends. In excess of 30 qualified coaches participated in the evaluations

Andrew Ransome (Pro Excel soccer camps) provided a one-hour goalkeeper training/evaluation session with several evaluators during the first weekend.

Dave Gold (Go-for-Gold soccer camps) provided a one-hour goalkeeper training/evaluation session with several evaluators during the second weekend.

### Age Group Breakout

A further breakdown of the player count and their respective coaches are as follows:

- U-14 Girls: 91 players registered; Coached by Owen Flannery (National C License)
- U-15 Girls: 89 players registered; Coached by Andrew Ransome (National A License)
- U-16 Girls: 58 players registered; Coached by Jan Nordmo (National A License)
- U-17 Girls: 45 players registered; Coached by Marty Bebler (National T C License)
- U-14 Boys: 120 players registered; Coached by Jack Rosenhan (National B License)
- U-15 Boys: 107 players registered; Coached by Steve Cochrane (National A License)
- U-16 Boys: 70 players registered; Coached by Brian Pelton (National C License)
- U-17 Boys: 56 players registered; Coached by Mehdi Siadat (National C License)

- Each youth was told their strengths and weaknesses, if cut.

- **PROBLEM:** Some youths were told, by their coaches, that the Spring games had to be attended and to miss ODP tryouts. This is not acceptable and must not be repeated next year. ODP tryouts are in the Spring to help prevent interfere with Fall competitive league play; missing ODP tryout time decreases a youths potential to be chosen for the District team that goes to the State ODP play days.

## 6.6. State Playing League

- There were 85 teams that applied to the league and many were D2 teams.
- The last week of the month is the tournament. The tournament may be at Stevenson.
- Where the home and away games are to be played has not been decided.
- Motion made to play all home games at the Morgan Hill Complex. No second made to the motion. Mel D. to poll the League Presidents for their SPL team home game field preferences.
- Steve D. wants all games played at Morgan Hill to schedule referees, otherwise he wants the leagues responsible for referees. This referee edict caused a stir since Steve D. is paid for the referee scheduling service. Dave M. will investigate the edict rigidity.
- The team fee is \$800 this year. The State office will refund field fees when submitted with a paid recite for SPL games.

## 6.7. Abronzino Playing League

- The ODP play day calendar is slightly different than previous years and needs to be accounted for in league play.
- Mandatory coaches meeting the week of September 3 or the coach will loose 9 points from the game points (league standings).
- Most leagues turned in their team counts; few remain to be received.
- SPL teams in the qualifying tournament are asterisked in the scheduling. The asterisk shows that the team may be in SPL, not Abronzino for the season.
- The Website will be on at the end of the month for registration.

- The State Chairman will be protesting the USSF hearing panel recommendations for dissolution of the InterDistrict release restrictions by some CYSA - North Districts.
- This dissolution recommendation may remove InterLeague Releases too.
- Nothing will change until the next AGM according to CYSA-North by-laws
- Orchard Valley, Marina and Gavilan have not signed the blanket InterLeague Release form for District 2.
- A draft copy of the D2 policy manual was distributed for comments. Written comments were requested for revisions to be made.

## 6.12. State Cup

- All done except for U19 Regional play on June 19.
- Four teams to go to the Regionals in Salt Lake City.
- The Regionals will be in Hawaii next year.

## 6.13. Association Cup

- Fines due from teams in Foothill and Orchard Valley that dropped from the tournament
- No other information to report.

- The dates will be October 5 and 6 for olders and November 23 and 24 for youngsters.

## 6.15. Spring Soccer

- Santa Cruz needs to pay their Spring fees.
- Discipline committee to work with Dan P. for assistance on some problems with Jeff Fagone.
- MJ has been a terrific help with the Spring league this year.

- First set of applications for finger printing received.
- Terry P. requested a copy of the 501(c) from anyone; Jan G. had a copy and agreed to send it to him.

## 7. Commissioner's Report

- The Y-League is not part of CYSA therefore they cannot be disciplined for poaching issues. A CYSA coach, also coaching in the Y-League, could be talked to if there are problems. No CYSA equipment can be used in the Y-League games; this includes jerseys with logos.
- The CyberRays and Earthquakes talked to the board.
- Affiliation papers are late from Redwood Jr., So. San Jose, Gavilan, and Los Gatos.
- Documentation or affiliation agreement information missing from Gavilan and Central Coast.
- New calendar approved:
  - ODP play days: girls will be 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday of September and October, and boys will be the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sunday of September and October
  - SPL games will be scheduled for the October tournament weekend, the 26<sup>th</sup> and 27<sup>th</sup>.
  - The Premier North-South Shoot Out will be moved forward to the 16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> of November to minimize high school conflict.
  - State and Association Cup dates are similar to last years.
  - CYSA AGM is February 1 and 2 in Sacramento.
  - State ODP tryouts are similar to last year's.
- The State ODP pool has been expanded by the number of National pool players and the coaches expanded by one for each team.
- SPL league fees raised from \$650 to \$1,050.
- SPL rules approved:
  - There are four automatic qualifiers from the previous year (four top of age group teams).

- The season will end sooner which impacts the October tournament weekend.
- The home and away schedules were not set at specific locations.
- Snickers State, Chevy and Tide Cup rules approved.
  - The entrance fees have been raised for the Chevy and Snickers Cups.
  - Chevy Cup raised from \$175 to \$250
  - Snickers Cup raised from \$300 to \$350
- A study is being conducted on the "ideal" length of tournament games.
- Knee braces being reviewed by risk management group with medical people.

### **9. New Business**

- Motion made to fund teams for regional games. Motion approved for \$1600 per team. Copy of bill to Paul G. for reimbursement check.

### **10. Good of the Game**

- DeAnza league bought a suite at a CyberRay game to treat volunteers. The cost is \$1600 with food, beverages, and closed circuit television for replays and close "on field" action. The League President urged more leagues to treat their volunteers to a game.
- The District will buy a suite and give two tickets to each league for use.
