1. Meeting called to order by Dave Mann, Commissioner, at 7:36pm.
2. The minutes of the July 2000 meeting were approved.
3. Treasurer's report.
 - All scholarship requests received to date have been processed. Checks to the leagues are in the mail. Dave would like to see leagues picking up 50% of the registration fee themselves. Dave wants to finalize all scholarship requests within the next 3 weeks.
4. Registrar Report
 - A schedule of monies owed or to be refunded by league for the 1999/2000 season was distributed. The gap between D2 and State records is 414 players.
 - Examples of Birth Certificates that are acceptable to CYSA are available from Jan. BCs that do not include the City/County/State certification seal and official signature are likely to be rejected.
5. Coordinators' Reports
 - 5.1 Disciplinary Committee..
 - Two new incidents are being investigated. (Redwood and Orchard Valley)

5.2 Tournaments

- Field conditions at Morgan Hill are causing concern for Leagues who have arranged to hold tournaments there.
- Wendy would like details of all scheduled U10 Jamborees sent to her so she can answer questions on that subject
- Dist.III and V will accept U10 teams from out of their district for their Jamborees provided the sponsoring club invites the team and both District Commissioners approve.

5.3. Morgan Hill

- The fields are not getting enough water due to equipment problems. The division of responsibility between the field maintenance contractor and CYSA is not straightforward. Meanwhile the deteriorating state of the fields may become a safety issue as the ground hardens and more stones come to the surface.
- Dave stated that CYSA was not interested in renting field space to other organizations. Nets and goals left out during a recent event had been seriously damaged..

5.4. ODP

- U14 has been reduced to 1 team. Only the U16s have 2 teams.
- State ODP changes proposed for next year include squad reduction from 40 players to 32 with only 18 players going on to regionals The Adidas/Reebok tournament will be hosted by N-CAL every year rather than every other year.
- ODP coaches are encouraged to give their players more notice of games and practices..

5.5. State Premier League

- The schedules are out. Steve Dippert said there were problems scheduling referees for both Abronzino & SPL on the same days. Dave asked for the issue to be resolved off-line.

5.6. Abronzino Playing League.

- Some referee issues will be covered at the mandatory meeting for all Abronzino coaches scheduled for **Thurs Sept 7**.

5.7. C3PL

- 190 applications are complete. 32 more have registered on the web. C3PL needs a hardcopy of each team roster with a league official's signature to be sure the team really exists.
- Schedules are due to be published on Aug 17.
- All teams should have on-line capabilities so that they can record their scores.

5.8. Coaching

- Several F classes are schedules, also goalie training classes.

5.9. Association Cup

- District teams may suffer if this position cannot be filled.
- U16 and U19 is an open cup competition, U12 and U14 are the same as last year. U14 District Cup cannot be used as a qualifying tournament since the sign-up deadline for U14 District cup has already passed.

5.10.State Cup

- Medal and pin designs have been picked. The prototypes were on view at the meeting.
- Medals will be awarded for 1st through 4th place. Likewise trophies for the coaches.
- There are still age groups that do not have a league signed up to host.
- A total of 272 teams have registered. Many have not paid their fees and so risk being dropped from the tournament.
- No class 4 teams have applied for District Cup.

5.15. Risk Management

- Many insurance claims arise because goal posts are not anchored. The referee should cancel the game if the goals are not anchored.
- The team manual contains a disclosure form that can be completed by all volunteers.

5.16. Referees

- Steve explained how red cards received during league play, tournaments and other situations were handled. In most cases the cards ended up with the league president. A summary of Steve's talk will be posted to the web.
- Coaches with 2 teams and therefore two coach cards are treated as two separate individuals. A red card penalty issued to the coach during a team-1 game is not served during subsequent team-2 games.

6. Commissioner's Report

- CYSA is asking for more time to resolve issues associated with the San Martin complex.
- 2000/2001 Team manuals will be delivered to League Registrars shortly. Game cards have already been delivered.
- Teams attempting to play with more than 18 players including guest players risk being disqualified.

- A motion to re-open discussion of the size of a U10 team roster was made by Dan Smyth, seconded by Bob Joyce. **Motion failed 3 - 7.**

- Alex Grave of Alexx's Soccer Shop passed away a few weeks ago. Alex's Soccer Shop is located on Santa Cruz Blvd in downtown Los Gatos.
- Ground has been broken for an 11.5 acre site that includes astro-turf soccer fields. The site, in Santa Clara near the 49ers training field will be able to support at least 20 games per week with no damage to the field surface!
