Dean Monroe - San Jose Proposition P proponent	

1. Meeting called to order by Dave Mann, Commissioner, at 7:40 PM.
2. Dean Monroe encouraged everyone living in San Jose to vote for proposition P. If passed, the proposition will make \$250M available for park improvements, sports facilities, walking trails etc. including \$9M to develop a 42 acre site for 8 floodlit soccer fields and a club house. Dave asked for support and volunteers to make phone calls. Contact Dave at 408-420-4285 or 408-286-5019.
3. Karl Dewazien gave an instructive presentation of numerous coaching issues including the inappropriateness of coaching from the side-lines during games which causes player confusion and is one of the reasons for players dropping out of the sport. Karl concluded with a practice session format. League and club coaching directors will be invited to a follow-up session at 7pm on Nov 13 to be held at Creekside at which Karl will present his ideas in more detail. 4. The minutes of the September 2000 meeting were approved with one correction. Under Registrar's report it should be noted that the State Registrar's Admin has resigned, not the Registrar..
5. Treasurer's report.
 - No report.

6. Registrar Report
 - Team manuals have been distributed but Jan would like any spares to be returned. There are 70 teams more than expected who need copies.
 - 1999/2000 season is over. The final report shows which leagues get refunds and which still owe money. Detailed registration reports were distributed. Copies are available on request.
 - WINREG is ready. Jan needs to know details of the clubs that each League may have.
 - Registration Operating and Procedures Manuals are available for League registrars. Contact Jan.

5. Coordinators' Reports
 - 5.1 Disciplinary Committee..
 - The red card list is now posted on the web. It specifies the time to be served per player.

 - 5.2 Tournaments
 - Applications to host a tournament received after the November 1 deadline will be charged a \$400 fee. See Wendy for paperwork. No applications yet from Orchard Valley or De Anza.

 - 5.3. Morgan Hill
 - Grass is starting to return at Morgan Hill Soccer Complex.
 - The \$25K put forward by District 2 showed commitment on the District's part and although it may not be used, is helping to move the San Martin process ahead .
 - Tournaments should still specify Morgan Hill as the venue until further notice.

 - 5.4. ODP
 - Last playday this Sunday.
 - A meeting is planned with Kulwant and Sue to discuss changes for next year.
 - It was noted that the ODP program is \$2500 over budget.

 - 5.5. State Premier League
 - Field renumbering at Morgan Hill is causing problems but 3 fields are still reserved for Premier.
 - Mel asked that no unqualified refs be assigned to Premier games for player safety reasons.
 - Changes next year may include a tournament to prevent weak teams from getting into the Premier League.

 - 5.6. Abronzino Playing League.
 - AGM was a success but the Abronzino League requires a treasurer.
 - The web and on-line score reporting working well. Reminder that teams who do not report their scores will not be invited back.
 - There have been problems with District 1 fields. Also, leagues are encouraged to provide quality and safe fields for Abronzino games. Referees can refuse to allow play on unsafe fields.
 - 2 hour delays before commencement of games is unacceptable.
 - U17/19 working well at Morgan Hill.
 - Coaches must be notified and consent before a player's relations can take the field as referees.
 - There are Abronzino rules to cover "bad" situations.
 - Only 9 red cards so far in Abronzino this year.

 - 5.7. C3PL
 - One Santa Cruz team complained that they didn't want to travel.

 - 5.8. Coaching
 - Coach of the year nominations to be in by Nov 30. A brief, informal video interview should be sent to Karl with the nomination.

- Fees for coaching clinics are due from Santa Clara, Orchard Valley and South San Jose.
- Note also Karl's coaching presentation scheduled for Nov 13.

5.9. Association Cup

- Applications and lots of detailed information are on the web.
- U12/U14 deadline is Nov 10, U16/U19 is an open cup with deadline Dec 11
- Teams (or their League) who drop out after being accepted will be fined.
- Teams who did not know that District Cup was the qualifier can still apply and may get placed as a wild card team (chosen by lottery). Teams who have not yet played District Cup should apply in anticipation of qualifying for Association Cup. Winners qualify, the rest enter the lottery.

5.10. State Cup

- Leagues must assign referees to District Cup as a priority over local non-cup games.
- Two teams did not pay.

5.15. Risk Management

- Do not pick up an injured player who cannot get up by himself or herself. The game should not be restarted until the player has been treated or carried off by qualified medical personnel.
- The Red Cross has a 4-hour training session in First Aid and CPR. Some leagues require coaches to take this training.

5.16. Referees

- Dave Morton described the District Cup as the best run ever for referees. Kudos to Ed and everyone who helped.
- Dec 2/3 Morgan Hill hosting the Adidas Showcase for the NCAA final 4
- Refs are getting stress fractures from the hard ground at Morgan Hill
